

Stephanie A. Bradley, Ph.D.

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Biography

Dr. Bradley holds a strong commitment to the land-grant university mission of sharing research with communities for their betterment. She has extensive experience synthesizing and translating research on public health, prevention science, implementation science, positive youth development, and adolescent development for policymakers, and advancing evidence-based policymaking at the state level (e.g., Type 2 and 3 translation; [Fishbein & Ridenour, 2013](#)). Using a service-oriented, partnership approach, she increased Pennsylvania policymaker adoption of evidence-based strategies for prevention and early intervention in youth problem behaviors (see next section for recent examples) for several years. In leadership positions at the Evidence-based Prevention and Intervention Support Center (EPISCenter) at Penn State University her work was grounded in the interactive systems framework (ISF; [Wandersman et al., 2008](#); [Rhoades, Bumbarger, & Moore, 2012](#)). The ISF identifies multiple systems and stakeholders invested in and influenced by prevention programs, research, and policy, and encourages interaction among these systems to maximize outcomes.

Over the course of her work in promoting adoption and scale up of evidence-based programs, Dr. Bradley's interests have evolved to incorporate addressing health disparities and health equity. By focusing on these issues, she aims to address the broader context of healthy development, and barriers identified by determinants of health models (e.g., social, economic, cultural). She is now focusing on developing, testing, improving, and disseminating policies and programs to eliminate health disparities for underrepresented minority youth and families.

Outreach and Systems Change Successes

Cross-Systems Prevention Workgroup (CSPW). The CSPW consists of over twenty, cross-sector, state and local leaders collaboratively developing a comprehensive, statewide prevention system and strategic plan. CSPW focuses on universal prevention and uses the public health approach to conduct statewide needs assessments and establish statewide prevention priorities. Efforts include establishing common definitions for "prevention" and "effective programs" and conducting a prevention program inventory across PA to identify which programs are funded and source(s) of funding. The value of this group's work rests in building bridges across systems to harmonize and synergize prevention efforts, using funding and local resources more effectively and synergistically, and achieving better outcomes for children, youth, and families sooner. I identified the need for an intentionally crafted, multi-sector prevention strategy, spearheaded and oversaw the development and coordination of the CSPW, and conceptualized a now-funded grant proposal to provide staffing support for their work (Byrne Justice Assistance Grants, FY2018, *Resource Development and Coordinated Planning*

for a Statewide Comprehensive Interagency Prevention System, \$149,899; PI Dr. Jochebed Gayles, Penn State University).

PA Opioid Misuse Prevention Project (OMPP). Pennsylvania consistently has one of the highest rates for opioid overdose and death in the U.S. As a result, policymakers, practitioners, and community members are scrambling to address this issue. As is too often the case, prevention is inadequately understood or deployed. Recent evidence identifies universal prevention strategies that are delivered in middle school prevent prescription opioid misuse into the early 20's (Crowley, Jones, Coffman, & Greenberg, 2014). Through multiple discussions with policymakers I facilitated their understanding and use of this evidence. This subsequently evolved into three state agencies developing five-years of funding to support local implementation of universal prevention programming to prevent youth opioid misuse. Myself and my team were integral to the design of the funding, project design requirements, and applicant eligibility. OMPP advances awareness and utilization of known-effective, universal prevention strategies for mitigating the opioid epidemic in PA.

PA Results First Evidence-based Policymaking Initiative. Pennsylvania has been a leader in adoption, dissemination, and sustainment of evidence-based programs (EBP) for behavioral health prevention and intervention for youth and families since the mid-90's. This included production of early reports identifying the return on investment in these EBP models. Adopting the Results First framework enables its government sites to use program cost and benefit estimates from jurisdiction data, allowing for more accurate estimates of return on investment. Its five-phase framework reflects the public health approach in its emphasis on using evidence-based programs to address public health and public safety needs, monitoring of program implementation and outcomes, and evaluating programs that lack an evidence base. I spearheaded partnership-oriented discussions between key leadership at Results First, the PA Office of Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention (OJJDP), and the Penn State Prevention Research Center. Ultimately, these discussions lead to OJJDP adoption of the Results First model to assess return on investment in the OJJDP menu of evidence-based programs.
